As a member of *Langley Manor CC* you are expected to abide by the following parents/guardians code of conduct:

- Encourage your child to learn the laws of the game and to play within the spirit of those laws.
- Discourage unfair play and disputes with officials.
- Help your child to recognise good performance, not just results.
- Do not force your child to take part.
- Do not enter changing rooms without permission of the manager.
- Do not punish or belittle a child for losing or making mistakes.
- Accept the judgment of the officials without public argument or comment.
- Do not use improper language at any time.
- Remember children are involved for their enjoyment – not yours.
