Langley Manor CC is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the well being of all its members.

Langley Manor CC believes that it is important that members, coaches, administrators and parents/carers or guardians associated with the club should, at all times, show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others.

Therefore, members are encouraged to be open at all times and to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the club with Trevor Longman (secretary), Geoff Rhodes (chairman), Mary Jerram (Child Welfare Officer) or your manager.

As a member of *Langley Manor CC* you are expected to abide by the following junior code of conduct:

- All members must play within the rules, be polite to and respect the officials and their decisions.
- All members must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- Members should behave appropriately at all times so as not to affect the opportunity or enjoyment of other members in playing, training or using club facilities.
- Members should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions or inform their coach or team manager if they are going to be late.
- Members must wear appropriate kit – Cricket whites and suitable trainers or cricket shoes for matches, tracksuits or shorts are acceptable for training.
- Members must pay membership subscriptions, match fees and fees for training (indoor) or events promptly. Advise you manager or coach in the event of a problem.
- Junior members are not allowed to smoke or consume alcohol or drugs on club premises or whilst representing the club.
- All players under 18 must wear helmets when batting or wicketkeeping when standing up to the stumps
